Professional excellence: we fight for our values as educators and researchers.

OUR VICTORIES

In recent years, UFF-UF has:

- Secured eight weeks each of paid parental and medical leave
- Won a major grievance, affirming a College of Education faculty member's right to develop a research specialization on racial justice
- Won another major grievance, which resulted in the reinstatement of a College of Engineering faculty member who had been unfairly targeted for an international collaboration
- Organized the #FreeUF coalition to engage the press, host protests and teach-ins, and pressure lawmakers about issues related to academic freedom and institutional independence
- Developed a new progress-to-promotion process for early-career non-tenure track faculty that facilitates promotion

- Defend academic freedom, tenure, and good governance at UF
- Fight racism, xenophobia, and discrimination
- Call for across-the-board raises
- Expand family and medical benefits
